In an attempt to better understand the world and the unknown, An Onghena explores the boundaries between art and science. With a subtle sense of humour and flirting with the fictitious, she integrates her experience in the applied arts into an autonomous artistic practice. In line with this she focuses in some works on the status of the artist book and analogue technologies, as seen against the backdrop of increasing digitization. In all her works, Onghena endeavors to activate the viewer of her work.

An Onghena (b.1992, B) received her MA Graphic Design and thereafter her MA of Research into Art & Design at Sint Lucas Antwerp. She was artist-in-residence at the Jan Van Eyck Academy, Maastricht and laureate of Toegepast20 in Z33. Recently her work was seen in "Paraphrase" at einBuch. Haus in Berlin, Germany; "Remodeling Graphic Habits, nr 86" at The Art Center Sarasota in Florida, USA; "Figures and Routines" at Sea Foundation in Tilburg, The Netherlands; "Bring Out Into The Open" at Goldberg Galerie in Munich, Germany. In November 2021 the work "A 2020 Olympic Poststamp" was installed permanently as part of the official Art Collection of the City of Antwerp. The work "Performance for the book" has been performed in various fairs and exhibitions from Europe to the United states.











Paraphrase

Starting from 'Performance for the book' the exhibition shows new sketches, drawings and works by the artist dating from 2018 until 2021. Following this, Onghena launches her new artist book 'werkboek' in collaboration with Jivan van der Ende. This publication can be seen as a reading tool with a performative and collaborative element, between the two artists as well as the two readers.














Bring out into the open

This exhibition shows 2 main directions from my practice: research into the colour black and materials such as paper and the performative characteristics of the work.




All indivual works are exist on their own but in the exhibition they come together as one narrative.


Since 2017, I'm printing a series of Mimeograph prints about daily encounters.




A 2020 Olympic Poststamp

A metal sculpture based on the Olympic stamps of the Discobolus from 1920 is permanently installed in the pond of the library at Kielpark.

In the resulting amplified and abstract two-fold image, the frontal view and also backside of the night sky are pictured.

The other side of the Moon









researching black

A continuous research into printing techniques and paper with the meaning to create as many blacks as possible. These pictures are the result of the first test with the following parameters:

- · CMYK 100g EOS 2.0 paper
- · CMYK 120g Munken Lynx Rough paper
- · 100% black 100g EOS 2.0 paper
- 100% black 120g Munken Lynx Rough paper.

The produces will evolve into a large spectrum of the colour black.














This was a project for Toegepast20 under the direction of Jan Boelen, Z33.


